need to be reflected in the way he is carved and of course the environment that he is placed in. I hope this is some help for your future carvings!

Carving Class with Ronnie Boston




Ronnie will teach how to carve this project. A 1x1x4" regular knife is fine but there are places a chip carving knife would help.


